

Your guide to gas safety. Take care, be Gas Safe.



What is Gas Safe Register?

Gas Safe Register is the official list of gas engineers who are registered to work safely and legally on gas appliances. By law, all gas engineers must be on the Gas Safe Register. It has replaced CORGI registration.



Why do I need to use a Gas Safe registered engineer?

In the right hands, gas is safe, but badly fitted and poorly serviced gas appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions and carbon monoxide poisoning. Only use a Gas Safe registered engineer to fit, fix or service your gas boiler, gas cooker, gas fire and other gas appliances. Gas Safe Register is here to help keep you and your family safe.

How do I find a Gas Safe registered engineer?

It's easy. All Gas Safe registered engineers are listed on our website **www.GasSafeRegister.co.uk** You can also call **0800 408 5500** and our advisors will help you find an engineer in your area.

How do I check my engineer is on the Gas Safe Register?

All Gas Safe registered engineers carry a Gas Safe Register ID card, with their own unique licence number, showing the type of work they are qualified to do. Before any gas work is carried out always ask for the engineer's ID card.

Remember to check both sides of the ID card for:

- the licence number
- the start and expiry dates of registration
- the security hologram
- the work your engineer is registered to do
- the engineer's up-to-date qualifications.

You can also check an engineer is registered by texting **Gas** and the engineer's seven-digit licence number to **85080**.

Gas engineers must be Gas Safe registered in the United Kingdom, Isle of Man and Guernsey.

KEEP SAFE IN YOUR HOME WITH THESE TOP TIPS:

- Only use a Gas Safe registered engineer to fit, fix or service your gas appliances.
- You can find or check a Gas Safe registered engineer by calling 0800 408 5500 or visiting www.GasSafeRegister.co.uk
- ✓ Always check the engineer's Gas Safe Register ID card.
- Check the engineer is qualified for the work you need doing – you can find this information on the back of their ID card, on our website or by calling us.
- Get your gas appliances regularly serviced according to the manufacturer's instructions and safety checked every year.

✓ The poisonous gas carbon monoxide cannot be seen or smelt. Fit an audible carbon monoxide alarm. It should be marked to EN 50291 and also have the British Standards' Kitemark or another European approval organisation's mark on it. Fit it according to the manufacturer's instructions.

- Check for warning signs that your gas appliances are not working correctly, e.g. lazy yellow flames, black marks or stains around the appliance and too much condensation in the room.
- Remember the six main signs and symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning:
 - 1. headaches
 - 2. dizziness
 - 3. nausea
 - 4. breathlessness
 - 5. collapse
 - 6. loss of consciousness.



GAS SAFETY AT HOME

It's important to take care of your gas appliances. Get your gas appliances checked once a year by a Gas Safe registered engineer. Annual maintenance not only helps keep your heating and hot water working properly, it helps keep you safe.

Badly fitted and poorly serviced gas appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions and carbon monoxide poisoning. Carbon monoxide is a highly poisonous gas. You can't see it, taste it or smell it but it can kill quickly with no warning.

If a gas fitter is not registered, they are working illegally and possibly unsafely. Saving pennies may seem like a good idea but using an illegal gas fitter could cost you and your family your lives. Don't take the risk, always use a Gas Safe registered engineer.

To comply with Building Regulations make sure your Gas Safe registered engineer notifies the installation of your gas appliance to Gas Safe Register and we will notify your local Building Control. You will receive Declaration of Safety and/or Building Regulations Compliance Certificates.

If you have had gas work done in the last six months you can nominate it for a free safety inspection. To nominate your property visit **www.GasSafeRegister.co.uk** or call **0800 408 5500**. Please note not all nominations can be inspected.

GAS SAFETY IN RENTED ACCOMMODATION

Landlords have legal duties under the gas safety law. Gas appliances supplied for a tenant to use must be maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. A Gas Safe registered engineer must also carry out a gas safety check every 12 months.

If you are a tenant always:

- Ask for a copy of the landlord's current gas safety record before you move in or after the check has been carried out.
- Check the Gas Safe Register ID card of any gas engineer that comes to do work in your home.
- Cooperate with your landlord and let a registered engineer in when a gas safety check or servicing has to be done.
- Arrange for any gas appliances you own to be regularly serviced and safety checked every year.

If a landlord refuses to regularly maintain and annually safety check gas appliances they provide – the gas safety law 'Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998' states they must do it – contact the Health & Safety Executive at www.hse.gov.uk/gas/domestic or call the HSE Gas Safety Advice Line on 0800 300 363.

Dangerous gas work can be deadly

Anne's story shows why you should never use an illegal gas fitter.



In 2004, Anne bought a house that needed a new central heating system and gas fire. She knew she needed a gas fitter who was registered, and thought the person she found was qualified to do the job.

When Anne returned from work on Good Friday the following year, she knew something was wrong as soon as she entered the house. She called for her 14-year-old daughter and rushed upstairs to find her lying on the floor. She had no pulse and there were bubbles around her mouth, caused as she had struggled to breathe.

I wiped the bubbles from her mouth with my shirt, and held her to me. My child was dead.

The emergency services came and realised immediately that it was carbon monoxide poisoning.

Anne ultimately discovered the person who fitted the gas fire was working illegally because he was not qualified or registered to carry out work on gas fires. He was prosecuted and received a two-year sentence for manslaughter. That finished on her birthday.

He took my daughter's life, and he took my life away. My message to anyone who wants gas work done in their home is never use an illegal gas fitter and always check the fitter's card to make sure they are Gas Safe registered and qualified to do all the work you need doing. And I would urge everyone to fit an audible carbon monoxide alarm. If something does go wrong it can save your life.
